The restrictions and requirements set forth in the by-laws and policies of the 100 Club of Central Texas apply to all benefits for members and non-members and may be changed at any time with or without notice.

The 100 Club may not be able to meet the full survivor benefit amount in the event of a catastrophic occurrence resulting in a larger than usual loss of life. In the case of a catastrophic occurrence, the 100 Club would make reasonable efforts to assist the dependents of the first responders.
